This letter responds to your Colorado Criminal Justice Records Act (CCJRA) request dated April 7, 2026 in which you requested:

"Good afternoon, Pursuant to the Colorado Criminal Justice Records Act § 24-72-301 et seq., I request that you make available for inspection and copying the following public records: - The internal affairs investigation file relevant to the resignation while under investigation of Alicia Lilly

If you are not the custodian of records for this request, please forward this letter to the appropriate person or let me know which person(s) has custody of these records. Please set a date and hour, within three working days following receipt of this letter, at which time the records will be made available. If access to these records will take longer, please cite the extenuating circumstances and let me know when I should expect copies or the ability to inspect the requested records. I ask that records available in their native format and be transmitted electronically by email to me at this email address.

If you deny any portion, or all, of this request, please provide me with a written explanation of the reason(s) for your denial, including a citation to each specific statutory exemption you feel justifies the refusal to release the information and notify me of the appeal procedures available to me under the law. If you conclude that portions of the records that I request are exempt from disclosure, please release the remainder of such records for inspection and copying, redacting only the portion or portions that you claim are exempt. Please contact me with any questions about my request by email or at 401-864-8019. Your records form is attached. Thank you for your time."

I am the custodian of records for the Professional Standards Unit (PSU), which includes formal Internal Affairs investigations. In review of the internal affairs investigation relevant to the resignation while under investigation of former officer Alicia Lilly, the following is a summary of that investigation and conclusion.

A review of the investigatory file identified an off-duty incident involving former officer Alicia Lilly. The inquiry documented that Lilly was contacted at a private residence while under the influence and was found to be in constructive possession of an unsecured firearm. These circumstances raised concern for a potential violation of Colorado's prohibited-use-of-weapons statute. No criminal charges were filed, and the internal investigation was not completed before Lilly resigned from employment.

After reviewing the Colorado Criminal Justice Records Act (C.R.S. § 24-72-301 et seq.) and the substance of the requested record, elements of your request are respectfully denied for the following reasons:

All other investigatory elements, including performance related information, supervisory assessments, internal communications, and any material not constituting a record of official action, are withheld. These portions of the file are denied pursuant to the statutory reasons provided below.

1. The records requested are not 'records of official action' as defined in C.R.S. § 24-72-302(7).
2. The records are not completed official internal affairs records concerning the in-uniform or on-duty conduct of a peace officer and a member of the public where an allegation of misconduct was raised, as outlined in C.R.S. § 24-72-303(4)(a).
3. Professional Standards records that occurred prior to April 11, 2019, are not governed by this statute (SB19-166).
4. Additionally, the release of any such records would be contrary to the public interest pursuant to C.R.S. § 24-72-305(5).

Had the investigation resulted in sustained findings, Lilly would likely have been subjected to termination of employment. However, since Lilly resigned while under investigation, the PSI was administratively closed with no finding.
