020320- I talked to the complainant, who alleged that either the police officers, firemen or coroner's employees that responded to her sister's death on May 22, 2019, stole all of her sister's lingerie. The complainant was "finally" able to talk about it. The complainant said the last time she saw the items was a day or two before her sister died; when the complainant was assisting her sister pack for a move. A few days after the death, the complainant's sister's daughter mentioned to the complainant that she could locate any of the items.

The complainant said one officer remained with her all the time and the other officer was in her sister's room with the firemen and coroner's employees. The complainant didn't recall the officers' names. The complainant was contacting the fire and police department and the coroner's office about the theft. The complainant said one of the officers removed a large bag containing her sister's medication. She said she asked them to make sure the medication they took was her sister's only and not her sister's dog, who was also on medication. In checking the bag, the dog's medication was removed from the bag. I told her that the medication would typically be recovered by the coroner's office.

After speaking with the complainant, I attempted to locate BWC footage. There had been footage , however it was retained until 072119.

I located the case report, which mentioned the coroner's office removed the sister's medication.-
