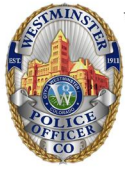

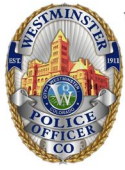

Westminster, Adams County, Colorado:

On 01/02/2022 I responded to the 860 W 132d Ave lot #180 on a report of a burglary to the residence. Dino Chatham DOB 10/01/1963 is the owner of the residence. Dino said he last saw his residence and items in tact on 12/31/2021 at 1300 hours, approximately two days ago. Dino said he has been away dog sitting at a friend's house.

Dino advised the residence was locked and no one had permission to enter the premise and to remove any items inside. Dino noted that his pool stick, chest set, and two black statues were found missing. No serial numbers were obtained.

I checked the residence and noted entry was made through the front door. The suspect used a tool to remove the door lock and get inside.

Dino noted the following items in the property section of this report stolen from inside the residence. The pool stick, chest set, and two statues, were located in the living room and door lock was attached to the door. The statues and chest set were inside of a glass cabinet. The pool stick was leaned up on the wall next to the dresser.

Dino said he is the only person with access and permission to enter the residence. Dino said he knows who did this to his house and said it was his neighbor, later identified as Matthew Oliver DOB 01-20-1980. Dino said Matthew is a neighbor and lives at lot #308. Matthew was not home and I was unable to contact him.

I took photographs of the residence. I checked with a neighbor at lot 280. The neighbor did not have any video surveillance and does not recall hearing or seeing anyone.

I returned later to the residence for follow up and Dino told me he came in contact with Matthew a short time after I had left. Dino said Matthew returned his pool stick but was still missing the other property items listed.

Dino mentioned to me that he realized two of his watches are missing. He described one watch to be a black/silver Movado and estimated the value to total \$450.00. The other watch was a silver citizen watch and this was estimated to be worth \$250.00.

I processed the scene for latent prints and was able to lift prints from the case in which the black Movada watch was inside according to Dino. The other set of prints came from a glass cabinet in which Dino said his black statues were inside of.

Dino provided me Matthew's phone number and I was able to speak to Matthew. Matthew said he is currently home and willing to speak to me. I arrived at Matthew's residence at lot #308. I asked Matthew what had happened between him and Dino and he provided me the following story:

Matthew said he went for a walk on New Years Eve around 0200-0300 hours. Matthew while on his walk said he noticed his neighbor Dino's door was left open. Matthew said he went to check what had happened. Matthew said he noticed the front door appeared to be forced open. Subsequently, Matthew said he noticed belongings that belonged to him inside of the residence. Matthew proceeded to walk in and collect the items he said were his. Matthew then exited the residence with the items, closed the front door, and proceeded to text Dino that someone broke into his residence. Also included in the text message was Matthew admitting that he observed items that belonged to him and that he collected them.

I confirmed with Dino that nobody had permission to enter inside of his residence while he was away and he reassured me that this was correct.

Matthew admitted to entering inside of the residence and stated he did not think there was anything wrong with his actions, he was retrieving items that belonged to him.

Matthew was arrested on the listed charges, booked in at WPD, and later transported to the Adams County Jail.

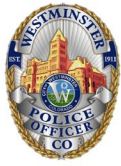

I spoke with Dino Chatham on 01/05/2022 and he told me the following. Suspect was having an estate sale. He went to the residence and saw a few things that he was interested in; however, Matthew Oliver (suspect) did not want to get rid of these particular items. A few hours later, Matthew came to Dino residence. They hung out and played chess. While at the residence, Matthew identified a few items of Dino's that he would be willing to trade. Dino gave Matthew an old philosophy book in exchange for Matthew's chess set and two small Aztec statues (black onyx pieces). Matthew also gave Dino a pool stick that was not a part of the trade.

Dino was scheduled to dog sit for a friend in the days after the trade took place. Dino began to receive messages from Matthew asking for the items back. Dino reminded Matthew that they conducted a trade and that he considered this a "binding deal." Subsequent text messages from Matthew informed Dino that he did not need to come home and that he (Matthew) would just go over there and obtain his things. Dino did not give Matthew permission to go into his residence to obtain the items.

Dino continued to recount the interaction at his residence. He said there were a lot of things that Matthew wanted from the residence but Dino "thinks" the only thing he agreed to trade was the philosophy book. Dino did admit that he could have missed something in regard to the items they traded. Next I asked Dino how he got the pool stick back. Dino said that he was driving home and he saw Matthew waving him down, telling him that he had the police on the phone. Dino did not stop as he did not want to talk to Matthew. As he began to park, he saw Matthew walking towards his residence so he turned around and went back toward Matthew. Matthew told Dino that he had the police on the phone and that he had "his stuff." Matthew went inside of his residence and came back out a short time later with a box of items. The box contained a 2 Dodger/Yankee books (value \$20) that Dino purchased at the estate sale, the pool stick a wood carving set (value \$129) and an alcoholics anonymous book. Dino did not know where the AA book came from and he said that wood carving set belonged to him and it was not a part of any transaction they conducted. Dino never received the Philosophy book and he said that the chess set and onyx statues were still missing. As the conversation continued, Dino said that Matthew told him that he left him some Sorrel's (winter boots). Dino understood this as Matthew indicating that he left the boots to make things even.

On 02/15/2022, I spoke with Dino Chatham via phone. I previously received a voice message from him indicating that he missed a voicemail from me.

Dino informed me that the message was from back in January and he doesn't check his voicemail often. I told him that the message was likely when I was initially trying to get a hold of him and I did not need anything additional at the present time. Dino also told me that he had a voicemail on his phone from Matthew Oliver. The voicemail indicated that Matthew asked to trade back the items they originally exchanged. He also called Dino by his name but pronounced it like the beginning of the word dinosaur and told him that he would be extinct like his ancestors. I asked Dino if he took this as a threat and he said that he did. Dino has since switched phones and said he no longer has the message. He then said that he has the old phone and will respond to T-Mobile to see if they can recover the message.

A heard from Dino later that day and he informed me that the voicemail could not be recovered without a formal legal request. A synopsis of the information in the voicemail is documented above and the phone call between myself and Dino was recorded and booked into evidence.com

On 04/08/2022 while cleaning out Officer C. Tennyson's equipment at the Westminster Police Department, City of Westminster, County of Adams, State of Colorado, I located two fingerprint cards, possibly from this incident. Officer C. Tennyson no longer works for the Westminster Police Department and I was turning in his equipment after checking it in.

The cards were located in his equipment from his locker and had been in my cubicle from 04/06/2022. I had not known the fingerprint cards were in with his equipment until 04/08/2022 when I began putting his equipment away. The equipment was in my cubicle from 04/06/2022 to 04/08/2022 and had not been moved to any other locations. I located the cards and found them to be marked from a burglary Officer C. Tennyson had gone to on 01/02/2022. Based on reading the report and the markings on the fingerprint cards indicate this is the case for the fingerprint cards. I am unaware of how long the cards had been with Officer C. Tennyson's belongings but would believe they had been there since 01/02/2022.

One of the cards was marked "01/02/2022, burglary back room, Movado watch case" the other card was marked with "Burglary near kitchen table, glass cabinet." I looked over the case and it appears that in his report Officer C. Tennyson listed latent fingerprints would be booked into evidence. I am unsure if these were the cards Officer C. Tennyson was referring to or not.

I booked the fingerprint cards into evidence under this CR number. Both cards were sealed in one plastic bag and placed into an evidence locker.

Due to the nature of this incident there is no body camera footage, no contact with anyone, only putting equipment from Officer C. Tennyson away.
