AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF ARREST WARRANT

BEFORE THE HONORABLE *Katharine J. Ellison*
JUDGE / MAGISTRATE

Affiant, CYNTHIA ADAIR, a commissioned law enforcement officer, being duly sworn, deposes and says that I have probable cause to believe that the person known as:

has committed the following criminal offense(s), namely:

- 1. C.R.S. 18-03-602(1)(C), STALKING, CLASS 5 FELONY, 1 COUNT
- 2. C.R.S. 18-09-111(1)(C), HARASSMENT, CLASS 2 MISDEMEANOR, 1 COUNT
- 3. C.R.S. 18-6-800.3, DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, UNCLASSIFIED, 1 COUNT

The facts establishing probable cause to believe that a criminal offense was committed and that the above named person committed that offense and showing grounds for the issuance of an arrest warrant are as follows:

The affiant, Investigator Cynthia Adair, has been a certified advanced peace officer in Texas since 2010 and was employed with the Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office. The affiant had been assigned to corrections, patrol, internal affairs, and criminal investigations division until relocating to Colorado. The affiant became a certified peace officer in Colorado in 2023. The affiant has been employed as an investigator by the Larimer County Sheriff's Office since February 2024 and is assigned to general investigations.

1. On November 13, 2025, at approximately 0240 hours, Larimer County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) Sergeant JUSTIN CALKINS emailed his chain of command reporting concerns about HUDSON POLICE DEPARTMENT K9 Officer EVAN ALLEN GOUDY (DOB 10/08/1991). In that email, Sgt. CALKINS reported that GOUDY had shown up at locations where LCSO Dispatcher ALLISON MORGAN-MAURO, DOB: 03/19/1992, was present, including TOM DAVIS SALOON, located at 450 N Cleveland Ave, Loveland, Larimer County, Colorado, and later that same night near her residence located at 4386 Timnath Parkway in Timnath, Larimer County, Colorado. He also stated that GOUDY emailed ALLISON from a "spoof" email address, stating, "Can we talk, you can't act like I don't exist." Sgt. CALKINS described the behavior as "borderline stalking" and expressed concern the conduct was escalating. Sgt. CALKINS also confirmed that ALLISON and GOUDY had been involved in an intimate relationship.
2. On November 13, 2025, at approximately 1831 hours, Sgt. CALKINS emailed your affiant directly with screenshots of text messages exchanged between himself and ALLISON from November 12–13, 2025. In those messages, ALLISON told him she believed GOUDY was in the parking lot of Tom Davis Saloon, asked him to pick her up, and asked him to conduct extra patrol at her residence.
3. On November 13, 2025, at approximately 1551 hours, your affiant interviewed ALLISON MORGAN-MAURO. ALLISON confirmed that she and EVAN ALLEN GOUDY were involved in an intimate dating relationship for approximately one to two years. She stated they met through social media, became close while both were going through divorces, and "fell in love," planning a future together. She described the relationship as emotionally intense, fast-moving, and at times unstable, including multiple breakups and reconciliations. ALLISON confirmed they were sexually intimate and that GOUDY frequently stayed at her residence, though he did not live there full-time. She additionally described the relationship as a "trauma bond," noting she loved GOUDY, felt responsible for his emotional wellbeing, and had difficulty separating from him despite repeated incidents of infidelity and boundary-pushing behaviors.
4. ALLISON stated she went to Tom Davis Saloon on November 12, 2025, with coworkers for their regular Wednesday outing. She stated that upon arrival, she saw what she believed to be GOUDY's personal truck parked outside and said she had not told him she

would be there.

5. ALLISON stated she has told GOUDY not to contact her and has blocked him on her phone. She stated he has contacted her after being blocked using alternate methods, including an email account she did not recognize, which she saw while riding in Sgt. CALKINS' vehicle on November 12, 2025.
6. ALLISON stated that GOUDY has shown up uninvited at her residence multiple times over the past several months. She stated this has happened "a lot," and Sgt. CALKINS is aware of at least four or five such visits. She stated that during some of these visits, GOUDY was intoxicated and had been dropped off by his roommate or by an Uber driver. She stated she has "come to expect it" and is "used to this."
7. ALLISON stated she regularly goes to Tom Davis Saloon on Wednesday nights with coworkers. She stated she did not tell GOUDY she would be there on November 12, 2025, yet she saw his truck in the parking lot and did not want to "deal with him," prompting her to ask Sgt. CALKINS to pick her up.
8. ALLISON stated that when she arrived home with Sgt. CALKINS on November 12, 2025, she again saw GOUDY's truck parked near the entrance to her neighborhood. She stated the truck was unoccupied and she did not see him inside it.
 - a. ALLISON stated that as she walked toward her garage door, GOUDY approached her on foot from between nearby houses. She stated she did not see him until he was already close to her. She did not report that he attempted to harm her.
 - b. ALLISON stated she went inside at Sgt. CALKINS' direction and did not hear the conversation between Sgt. CALKINS and GOUDY.
9. ALLISON stated she does not feel unsafe around GOUDY, reported no physical violence during their relationship, and stated she does not believe he would harm her. She stated she has previously been concerned that he may harm himself, referencing a prior incident where he shared his location with her at Weitzel Park in Timnath, Larimer County, CO, late at night, stopped responding, and was later found asleep in his truck after she requested a welfare check.

10. Following your affiant's interview with ALLISON, your affiant conducted a recorded interview with Sgt. CALKINS. He stated that on November 12, 2025, at approximately 2357 hours, ALLISON texted him asking for a ride because she saw GOUDY in the parking lot of Tom Davis Saloon. He stated she appeared nervous about encountering GOUDY there.

11. Sgt. CALKINS stated that after leaving the bar, as they approached ALLISON's subdivision, she saw a truck she recognized as belonging to GOUDY parked near the neighborhood entrance. Based on her reaction, he began driving her toward her mother's residence, but her mother did not answer the phone. ALLISON then asked him to take her back to her residence.

- a. When they returned, Sgt. CALKINS observed GOUDY walking through a dark, unlit area between residences. He stated GOUDY was not walking on the sidewalk and was instead walking through the grass between the houses as he approached.
- b. Sgt. CALKINS stated he heard GOUDY say he wanted to talk to ALLISON, and that ALLISON responded she did not want to talk. He stated he told GOUDY several times to leave her alone and go home.
- c. Sgt. CALKINS stated that during this contact, GOUDY repeatedly questioned him about whether deputies were allowed to give people rides home from bars. Sgt. CALKINS described this as similar to an earlier incident where GOUDY confronted another deputy giving ALLISON a ride home.
- d. Sgt. CALKINS stated he told GOUDY he was close to being arrested and warned him about jeopardizing his law enforcement career. Sgt. CALKINS stated that GOUDY responded, "fuck you man," before walking away on foot.
- e. Sgt. CALKINS stated he remained in the area conducting additional patrols to ensure GOUDY did not return. He later received additional messages from ALLISON asking to be placed on an unofficial extra-check list for her residence.

12. Sgt. CALKINS stated that while ALLISON often minimizes her fear when speaking formally, her requests and actions show concern, including contacting him to avoid encountering GOUDY, requesting extra patrol, expressing worry that GOUDY "always shows up" at Tom Davis, and asking him to wait until her garage door was closed before leaving.

13. Based on the statements provided by ALLISON and Sgt. CALKINS, GOUDY has, on more than one occasion, followed, contacted, and approached ALLISON after being told not to do so, including appearing at locations where she did not disclose she would be, contacting her from alternate accounts after being blocked, showing up uninvited at her residence multiple times, and approaching her at night from between residences.

- a. His uninvited late-night presence, his concealed approach at her residence, his surveillance-like behavior, his emotionally unstable behavior, and his disregard of her requests for no contact would cause a reasonable person to experience fear or distress. As an armed, active-duty police officer with training in tactics and access to weapons, the impact of his actions was heightened.
- b. These actions meet the elements of Stalking under CRS 18-3-602(1)(c) and Harassment under CRS 18-9-111(1)(c). Because the conduct occurred within the context of a prior intimate relationship, the Domestic Violence sentencing enhancement under CRS 18-6-800.3 applies.

14. Based on the involvement of law enforcement personnel, including the suspect, victim, and witnesses, your AFFIANT requests that the Court seal the records under Crim. P. 55.1.

THEREFORE, based upon the preceding information, your AFFIANT respectfully requests the Court to issue an arrest warrant for EVAN ALLEN GOUDY, DOB: 10/08/1991, for the above-described offense(s) which occurred in the County of Larimer, State of Colorado.

Your affiant further requests the Court to limit public access to the affidavit and warrant pursuant to Crim. P. 51.1 (a)(4), for the purpose of safely effectuating the arrest of the suspect named herein and notifying the parties of the arrest.

- Your affiant requests this order limiting public access to expire after the suspect named herein is apprehended and upon first appearance in the judicial division in which the case will be permanently assigned.
- Such an order is needed to keep the record from public inspection and possible dissemination to serve the substantial interests of avoiding 1) the possibility of flight 2) security risks to arresting officers or named witnesses, and 3) any possible tampering or intimidation of named witnesses.
- Such limited public access constitutes the least restrictive means existing to protect the substantial interests above, and public access to the records will be restored without undue delay. Your affiant believes the substantial interests override the presumptive public access to the records for the above reasons, and your affiant asks the Court to so find pursuant to Crim. P. 55.1 (a)(6)."

Your affiant further requests that the Court issue a protection order pursuant to C.R.S. 18-1-1001 for the following protected party:
