Summary:

On April 2, 2025 I, Sergeant Ryan Jacobsen 2304, along with Lt. Tim Stankey 1416 met via Microsoft Teams with DDA Ben Hostetter of the 4th Judicial District Attorney's Office. Hostetter wished to report something he felt we needed to be aware of. It was alleged that under Court Case [REDACTED] Officer Jeffrey Johnson-Dean may have gave false testimony while on the stand in a Vehicular Assault case.

According to Hostetter, Johnson-Dean spoke to two witnesses for CSPD case [REDACTED] who were able to positively identify the suspect. When questioned why this identification was not in the report, nor on BWC Johnson-Dean stated he got this information later from the witnesses and that his BWC was not activated at the time.

Hostetter stated that the attorney's spoke with the two witnesses who denied ever making a suspect identification to Johnson-Dean.

A criminal investigation was opened and is being investigated by CSPD Violent Crimes. This Level 2 will be suspended until the conclusion of the criminal case.

On 04/23/25 I (Lt. Tim Stankey 1416) met with Lt. Scott regarding the status of the criminal investigation. Lt Scott advised that Investigations was unable to get to a level of probable cause and the case was inactivated. After receiving this information, I met with DC Rosenoff to discuss the appropriate level of the internal investigation. With the potential perjury charge not being applicable, DC Rosenoff determined that the case should appropriately be classified as a level 1. I changed the case from a level 2 to a level 1 investigation and will assign it to the appropriate division chain of command. email from Lt. Scott is attached.
