Summary:

On 9/23/24 the Internal Affairs Unit was contacted by a complainant identified as [REDACTED] (DOB: 3/5/81). The complainant stated that they called 911 on 9/22/24 because their boyfriend attempted suicide by taking a bottle of pills. The complainant stated that CSPD officers responded and assisted with the situation. The complainant stated that the female officer that responded was rude, aggressive, and made the complainant feel like they were a criminal when they were the one who called 911 to save their boyfriend's life. The complainant stated that they had to tell the officer to back up because the officer got extremely close to the complainant and the officer was snapping orders at the complainant such as "can't touch that." During their interaction the complainant stated that the female officer rolled her eyes at the complainant when the complainant asked the officer for her business card. The complainant feels that the officer was very disrespectful and feels that she did not need to deal with the officers attitude while they were dealing their boyfriend attempting suicide. The officers that were dispatched to the complainant's residence were identified as Officer J. Johnson-Dean #6806, and [REDACTED]. The complainant wished to file a complaint against [REDACTED].
