Summary:

On 08/03/23 the Colorado Springs Police Department Internal Affairs Unit was contacted by a complainant identified as [REDACTED] (DOB:5/31/63). The complainant stated that on 8/3/23 at approximately 01:00 hrs. she and her husband were contacted at their home by Officer Johnson-Dean #6806. Officer Johnson-Dean told them that he was investigating a hit and run traffic accident involving their vehicle. The complainant explained that the vehicle in question does belong to them, but they let their daughter drive it. Officer Johnson-Dean told the complainant that he had the license plate to her vehicle, and he claimed he got from the accident scene. The complainant feels that this is impossible because her husband told her that she saw the license plate on the vehicle earlier that day. The complainant feels that Officer Johnson-Dean is lying about where he obtained the license plate. Additionally the complainant feels that if the officer did recover the license plate from an accident scene that it should have been placed into evidence, not handed over to his daughter. The complainant felt that Officer Johnson-Dean intentionally blinded her daughter's security camera / doorbell while he stole the license plate off of her vehicle, thus fabricating the evidence he claims to have recovered from the accident scene.

The complainant also feels that Officer Johnson-Dean should not have contacted her because she lives in El Paso County not within the Colorado Springs City Limits. The complainant feels that Officer Johnson-Dean is out of his jurisdiction in this matter. While the complainant was interacting with Officer Johnson-Dean she provided him with her insurance information, and he took a photo of it. The complainant feels that this was inappropriate, and she is not comfortable with him having her insurance information.
