Summary:

Complainant writes in that an officer came at an unreasonable time of the night.

A CSPD officer came to our home at 1 AM this morning and asked to speak to our son. My wife woke me and my son to come to the door. It turned out he was investigating a pair of missing headphones via a complaint from my son's locker partner. His 'evidence' was a text from a third kid saying he had the headphones but that my son had sold them to him. My son was polite and cooperative and told the officer that he did not have the headphones and that the three boys had been joking back and forth about having them to tease the complainant. This was not a life-threatening emergency and it wasn't a 'crime' that had just occurred,. There was NO reason that it could not have waited for a more reasonable hour. I had to be to work at 6 AM today and my son has final exams today!! I am LIVID that this officer did not exercise better judgment and some plain old common sense. I would like him to be reprimanded and I would like an apology for his complete lack of situational awareness.
