Summary:

IA After hours notification of use of force (tackling a suspect) possibly resulting in SBI. Notified the suspect had a broken leg but due to the suspect jumping numerous fences and landing on hoods of cars while trying to escape officers prior to use of force, it is unknown when the suspect's actual injury occurred. Reviewed the case and no issues or concerns noted.

Graham v Connor Factors:

The following factors resulted in a use of force:

- Why and how the contact occurred: CSPD received multiple calls for service involving a male jumping fences and into backyards in the area of the 4800 block of [REDACTED] Drive South. The male party was believed to be under the influence of narcotics.

- Describe the force/resistance used against the officer or others: Officers attempted to contact the male several times but he continued running away from officers and jumping into backyards. As the male ran I warned him to get

on the ground or he would be tased. The male continued running and tried jumping a fence into another backyard in the 4800 block of [REDACTED] Drive North.

- Describe the force used by the officer against the individual: As the male began going over a 6' foot privacy fence I tackled the male. The fence broke and myself and the male fell through the fence into the backyard. The male rolled to his right side and attempted to stand up. I ordered the male to the ground and took control of his left arm/wrist and moved it behind his back. After additional officers arrived and after a brief struggle the male was placed into handcuffs.

07-26-19 - I, Sgt. Pamela Castro 2153, am assigned to Internal Affairs. I was notified of this UOF as an after hours call out when it was discovered at the hospital that the suspect had a broken leg. Due to there being BWC and the significant time lapse between the UOF and the notification, I did not respond at that time. I reviewed the BWC video for this incident and did not find any issues with the objectively reasonableness of the force. I noted that [REDACTED] UOF report had been sent back to him on June 27th by [REDACTED] and that [REDACTED] had not made the required changes and forwarded the report. I emailed Sgt. M. Snuggs and requested he have [REDACTED] complete the report immediately.

While reviewing the BWC, I noted after the UOF on [REDACTED] BWC I can hear an officer ask the suspect if he needed medical attention and the suspect answer in the affirmative. Then when the officers stand the suspect up and walk him to the car, I can hear the suspect repeatedly tell officers his leg hurts and make noises that sound like he is in pain. The officers tell the suspect to put his leg down and walk to the car. I spoke with DC Vasquez, who approved having Commander Rosenoff (SH) and Commander Strassner (SED) address this training issue. I spoke with Commander Rosenoff and emailed Commander Strassner referring the training issue to them to address.
