AFFIDAVIT OF PROBABLE CAUSE		

The following affidavit is submitted to the Court to document the probable cause in support of the arrest of
JOSHUA RAY ALCON, DOB: 01/28/1988, SSN: [REDACTED] A WHITE MALE, 5'08", 300 POUNDS
WITH BLACK HAIR AND BROWN EYES.

This offense is fully documented in Colorado Springs Police Department report 2025-00311235 detailing the offense(s) of:

- §18-3-203(1)(I), ASSAULT IN THE SECOND DEGREE, CLASS FOUR FELONY (F4)**
- §18-3-204(1)(A), ASSAULT IN THE THIRD DEGREE, CLASS ONE MISDEMEANOR (M1)**
- §18-9-111(1)(A), HARASSMENT, CLASS ONE MISDEMEANOR (M1)**

On 08/16/2025 at approximately 0016 hours, Officer B. Imgrund/7744 and Your Affiant, Officer D. Gutierrez/7825, herein after referred to as I, were dispatched to a domestic violence related disturbance at [REDACTED] located in the City of Colorado Springs, County of El Paso, State of Colorado. Call screen notes indicated the reporting party, Darekus McCrae, DOB: 09/10/1984, could hear a female screaming and the female saying she wanted to leave.

Officer B. Imgrund/7744 and I spoke with Mr. McCrae outside of the location. Mr. McCrae explained that he was a DoorDash driver delivering food on the third floor when he could hear yelling from upstairs on the fourth floor and followed it to room #409. Mr. McCrae knocked and was met by a male and female inside the apartment with the female expressing she wanted to leave. Mr. McCrae asked the male to let the female leave when the male started yelling at Mr. McCrae. Mr. McCrae stated the male started to close the door when the female started screaming again. Mr. McCrae held the door open and advised the male he would call police if he did not let the female leave. Mr. McCrae stated the male then slammed the door on him, so he contacted police. Mr. McCrae advised me that minutes later the female came outside the apartment and left the location.

Officer Imgrund and I then spoke with male inside apartment #409, who verbally identified himself. Mr. Alcon spoke with us through the door saying he was the only one inside. Officer Imgrund explained the call for service and that we needed to make sure everyone was okay, if he could open the door and talk with us face to face. Mr. Alcon would not open the door and continued stating there was no danger. Mr. Alcon stated a neighbor was the one yelling and arguing loudly. Mr. Alcon eventually advised Officer Imgrund and I that he and his wife, Abby, had been in an altercation.

Mr. Alcon stated Ms. Alcon had hit him on the head with a closed fist roughly 45 minutes before police arrived. Mr. Alcon informed us he was not bleeding and there was no bump and that he just wanted to go to bed. Mr. Alcon stated that Ms. Alcon got mad at him because he got drunk and went home. Mr. Alcon then came out of the apartment and let Officer Imgrund check his head for any injury. Mr. Alcon advised Officer Imgrund he would like a medical professional to check him out instead. Mr. Alcon denied being physical with Ms. Alcon, only that she hit him on the head and left the apartment.

I later spoke with Abby Michelle Alcon, [REDACTED] over the phone. Ms. Alcon was driving to Denver to stay with a friend as she was afraid of Mr. Alcon. Ms. Alcon advised me she was still close by and advised me she was scared to come back. I asked Ms. Alcon to return to the area and speak with me in the parking lot of the apartment complex. While conducting my interview with Ms. Alcon, Sergeant (Sgt.) E Ingalsbe/ stood with Officer Imgrund and Mr. Alcon, engaging in casual conversation. Sgt. Ingalsbe stated Mr. Alcon advised them he was hit in the back of the leg and wanted medical attention. Mr. Alcon mentioned he and Ms. Alcon had wrestled a bit during their altercation. Officer Imgrund began to ask Mr. Alcon about the wrestling when Mr. Alcon rephrased his statement and stated there was a struggle.

I confirmed with Ms. Alcon her relationship with Mr. Alcon, and she stated they had been married since October of 2024. Ms. Alcon advised me that she and Mr. Alcon had just come home from Littleton, Colorado when he became very aggressive inside their apartment. Ms. Alcon stated Mr. Alcon began throwing her around the apartment and strangling her.

Ms. Alcon advised me she had difficulty breathing and pain deep in her chest on neck/jawline as she was strangled at least six times tonight. Ms. Alcon stated Mr. Alcon had both hands around her neck pressing firmly on her throat. Ms. Alcon also stated Mr. Alcon used his forearms to choke her, again pressing on her throat. Ms. Alcon stated she was strangled at least six times, each time ranging from approximately three to four seconds. Ms. Alcon explained she did not lose consciousness, however there were a few times tonight when she felt as if she would throw up due to being choked. Ms. Alcon advised me her chest had a deep pain where her lungs would be and a sore neck. She explained during one of the times she was strangled, her vision was starting to fade as if she might pass out. Ms. Alcon also mentioned having difficulty swallowing, a sore throat, and limited neck motion as it caused her pain to move her neck far. I asked Ms. Alcon what Mr. Alcon was saying during the strangulation. Ms. Alcon advised me Mr. Alcon was saying, "I can kill you if I want," and multiple other phrases along the same premise. Ms. Alcon said she was able to bite Mr. Alcon's leg either on the back of the calf or thigh at one point to get him off her, though she does not recall the leg or exact area.

Ms. Alcon also explained that Mr. Alcon was grabbing her hair, hitting her head on objects, and kicking and laying on top of her while on the ground. Ms. Alcon stated Mr. Alcon had grabbed her by the hair and hit her head on a dresser. I observed multiple injuries to Ms. Alcon with one of these injuries on her head, consistent with her explaining where her head was hit by the dresser. The mark on her head had fresh blood and a slight bruise. Ms. Alcon stated she was on the ground and being kicked by Mr. Alcon, and she had a cut on her right leg with fresh blood.

Ms. Alcon informed me she had video footage from her "Ring" front doorbell that could capture her leaving the apartment after an initial altercation. The video footage Ms. Alcon provided me with showed her leaving the apartment in such a hurry that she fell in the hallway, got up, yelled "Get away from me!" and can be seen quickly going down a hallway to get away. Mr. Alcon can be seen quickly following Ms. Alcon to the door while naked, appearing to be chasing her. Mr. Alcon stood in the doorway and can be heard saying, "I was just playing," and "Come back." Ms. Alcon was then seen returning to the apartment, talking to the Ring doorbell camera saying she needs help. Ms. Alcon advised me she returned to the location because she was scared if she did not go back, Mr. Alcon would get angrier. Ms. Alcon also stated she had cats inside the apartment and was scared Mr. Alcon would do something to them.

Ms. Alcon provided another Ring video of the reporting party, Mr. McCrae knocking and interacting with Mr. Alcon. This video depicts Mr. McCrae advising Mr. Alcon to let Ms. Alcon leave or he would call police. Mr. Alcon can be heard yelling multiple racial slurs at Mr. McCrae with Ms. Alcon screaming in the background. Mr. Alcon attempted to close the door on Mr. McCrae, but Mr. McCrae held the door cracked open. Mr. McCrae explained to Mr. Alcon again that he will call police if he did not let Ms. Alcon leave. Mr. Alcon then slammed the door shut, prompting Mr. McCrae to call 911.

The defendant's conduct was an act or threatened act of violence against an intimate partner and constitutes Domestic Violence as defined in C.R.S. 18-6-800.3. Each foregoing offense was committed in, and is triable in El Paso County, Colorado.

Your Affiant would respectfully request that probable cause be found that **JOSHUA RAY ALCON, DOB: [REDACTED] SSN: [REDACTED] A WHITE MALE, 5'08", 300 POUNDS WITH BLACK HAIR AND BROWN EYES**, did, within the City of Colorado Springs, County of El Paso, State of Colorado, commit in violation of the Colorado Revised Statutes 1973 as amended, the offense(s) of **§18-3-203(1)(I), ASSAULT IN THE SECOND DEGREE, CLASS FOUR FELONY (F4); §18-3-204(1)(A), ASSAULT IN THE THIRD DEGREE, CLASS ONE MISDEMEANOR (M1); §18-9-111(1)(A), HARASSMENT, CLASS ONE MISDEMEANOR (M1).**
