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On 11/12/18 I was assigned to module 6A at the Jefferson County Detention Facility, located at 200 Jefferson County Parkway, Golden, CO 80401.

At approximately 1530 hours I received information about drugs in the module from an Inmate/Detainee (I/D) who I recognized as [REDACTED] (JCID #P-1058608).

[REDACTED] told me that I/D Justice Espinoza (JCID #P-1010180) was bring dugs into the jail. [REDACTED] told me those drugs would be black tar heroin. [REDACTED] said that the two White males in cell 17 were distributing the drugs and the two Hispanic males in cell 22 were distributing the drugs as well. [REDACTED] also went into detail about the two males in cell 22 having the drugs inside of the commissary radio ear buds.

The two males in cell 17 are Bradley Loomis (JCID #P-1083291) and Joseph Porto (JCID #P-1068741) and the males in cell 22 are Alberto Ohlmeirer (JCID #P-1097004) and Damian Sibayan (JCID #P-1054272).

Based on this information I informed a Sgt. Stokley about what possibly could be going on. Sgt. Stokley gave me the okay to search those I/D's and their cells for the drugs.

At approximately 1700 hours Justice was in the staging area getting ready to do his module worker duties. Justice and I both saw the module door open and we also saw Deputies about to come into the module to help look for the drugs. I told Justice to go lock down for now. Justice seemed to be a little suspicious as to why I needed him to lock down. Justice asked me why he was needed to lock down and I told him to just lock down. Justice went into unit 2 and I lost sight of him for few seconds. I began to shut all the water off to all the cells so no one could flush down any evidence. I then saw Justice at the dayroom toilet and I heard the toilet flush. Justice then quickly walked into his cell and shut the door behind him.

The search for the drugs began at 1705 hours. See supplemental reports for further information.

I remained at the Deputy workstation until the search was concluded.

On November 11, 2018 I was working as a uniformed deputy assigned to level 3 escort in the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office Detention Facility located at 200 Jefferson County Parkway, Golden, CO. At 1656 hours Deputy Rhodes informed me that we were approved to do an administrative search of module 6A, unit 2, cells 17, 22, 24, 29. We were informed that there was possibly black tar heroin and suboxone in the unit and was being distributed from those specific cells. I was the first deputy to enter 6A and inform the module deputy that we were doing an administrative search and to have the water turned off. As the water was being turned off I noticed I/D Espinoza, Justice flush the dayroom toilet and hurry back to his cell. I informed the other deputies who were involved in the search what had just occurred and we then entered the module to begin the search.

Deputies Rhodes, Bennett, Rosales, and Peralta completed unclothed body searches of inmates:

After each I/D was searched I escorted them out to level 6 visiting booths for the duration of the cell searches.

Deputy Cauley and I were assigned to search cell 17 which currently housed I/D Porto and I/D Loomis. I began my search counter-clockwise and floor to ceiling, as Deputy Cauley searched clockwise. We found nuisance contraband items which were disposed of. I found a handwritten note located on the desk under paper towels which read "Hey G, So you gave my celli 7 squair's and I guess he came and got 4 more and hes saying you said he...". I found another note located in the gray tub under the desk which read "Munsta, Hey G. Could you possibly ask Ice (Espinoza) if he could store...". Both notes were turned over to Deputy Rhodes. I/D's were escorted out of the visiting booths and back to their cells where normal module operations continued.

On November 11th 2018, I was assigned to the Jefferson County Detention Facility Module 5B. At approximately 1650 hours, I was contacted by Deputy Rhodes in 3 Floor Control to assist with an administrative search in 6A. Upon arriving at 6A, I was instructed to conduct unclothed searches on several inmates. Using the medical closet, I performed an unclothed search on the following inmates: Porto, Joseph Eugene Jr. (JCID# 1068741) at 1703 hours; Ohlmeier, Alberto (JCID# 1097004) at 1706 hours; Espinoza, Andrew (JCID# 1010180) at 1709 hours; and Shotwithtwoarrows, Justin (JCID# 1063112) at 1712 hours.

From approximately 1715 hours to 1745 hours, Deputy Rosales and I searched cell 22, currently housing Ohlmeier, Alberto (JCID# 1097004) and Sibayan, Damian (JCID# 0105472). Only nuisance contraband was found and it was disposed of per Jefferson County Sheriff's Office Policy and Procedure.

From approximately 171747 hours to 1815 hours, Deputy Rosales and I searched cell 28, currently housing Wilkins, Darus (JCID# 01050395). Only nuisance contraband was found and it was disposed of per Jefferson County Sheriff's Office Policy and Procedure.

At approximately 1815 hours, the search was concluded and I resumed my normal duties in Module 5D.

Rhodes #2479

On 11-12-2018 I was working as the Module 7A Deputy at the Jefferson County Detention Facility. At approximately 1630 hours I assisted with escorting I/D [REDACTED] (JCID# P01058608) from Module 6A to the Special Housing Unit (SHU) due to [REDACTED] having suicidal thoughts. As I was escorting [REDACTED] to the SHU, he told me that he was trying to get away from certain people in unit 2 due to him wanting to avoid the rampant drug use in the unit. [REDACTED] said that he use to work for "Ice" a nickname for I/D ESPINOZA,JUSTICE ANDREW (JCID# P01010180) who is one of the Module workers in 6A. I asked I/D [REDACTED] to elaborate on what he meant by "work for him", and he said that he use to distribute drugs for Espinoza in the unit. I/D [REDACTED] told me the following:

Espinoza gets the drugs from the "outside" from people he knows, and then has his "people" distribute them

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throughout the module. The drugs that were currently present in the module were heroin and suboxone. The suboxone was being kept underneath the black pads of the ear buds for the radios issued from commissary, and I/D [REDACTED] believed that I/D Espinoza was holding onto the heroin for safekeeping. I asked I/D [REDACTED] if he knew where the drugs were being kept, and he said that he knew cells 17, 29, 22, 24, and 28 were directly involved in stashing the drugs so that I/D Espinoza could sell them for envelopes, commissary items, and for money on his books.

I spoke with the Module Deputy in 6A, Deputy Manwaring who confirmed that I/D [REDACTED] had told him the same information. Sgt. Stokley was present for this conversation and authorized an Administrative search to be conducted. I gathered a team of Deputies and we entered Module 6A to begin our search of unit 2. By mistake, the module door was opened before we were ready to enter, and I/D Espinoza saw us in the hallway. According to Deputy Manwaring, I/D Espinoza was in the staging area getting ready to serve dinner when he saw us, and ran back into Unit 2 and went directly to the dayroom toilet and began flushing an unknown substance. Please see Deputy Manwaring's report for further information.

I assisted with unclothed body searches of I/D's:

- SIBAYAN,DAMIAN SETH (JCID# P01054272)
- DOCKARY,MICHAEL DEVON (JCID# P01119983)
- ORTEGA,JAMES MARTIN (JCID# P00192353)

After placing the inmates in visitation booths, I began searching cell 29 which housed I/D's Espinoza and Ortega. Several bags were found with coffee wrapped up, ready for distribution. Also several black pads for ear buds were found in the cell. There were a ton of extra blankets, sheets, clothes, and nuisance contraband in the cell. The nuisance contraband was disposed of per JCSO policy. Approximately 30 envelopes were recovered from the cell as well. The envelopes are being kept at the Deputy Workstation in order to verify why I/D Espinoza has so many. I interviewed I/D Ortega, after searching his cell, and he did not wish to speak with me. He did say that he knows "who snitched". I placed keep separates on I/D [REDACTED] and everyone that we searched.

Deputy Walpole found two notes from cell #17, which housed LOOMIS,BRADLEY MARTIN (JCID# P01083291) and PORTO,JOSEPH EUGENE JR JCID# P01068741). One note read: "Hey G, So you gave my celli 7 squair's and I guess he came and got 4 more and hes saying you said he..." The other note said "Munsta, Hey G. Could you possibly ask Ice (Espinoza) if he could store..."

I returned to my normal duties at about 1830 hours after returning all of the inmates back to their cells.

On 111118 I was assigned as a DSU Escort in the Jefferson County Detention Facility located at 200 Jefferson County Parkway, Golden, Colorado 80401.

At about 1640 hours I was on level 4 assisting with a walkthrough in Module 4B. When I finished my walk, I went into level 4 floor control. At that time I was informed I was needed at level 3 floor control to stage for an administrative search in Module 6A, unit 2. At about 1654 hours, I and other deputies arrived by elevator at the level 6 staging area. I was told there was possibly narcotics in certain cells of unit 2.

When I entered 6A I assisted in removing the following inmates:

- Bradley Martin Loomis (JCID #P-1083291) (Cell 17)
- Joseph Eugene Porto Jr. (JCID #P-1068741) (Cell 17)

- Alberto Ohlmeier (JCID #P-1097004) (Cell 22)
- Damian Seth Sibayan (JCID #P-1054272) (Cell 22)

- Michael Devon Dockary (JCID #P-1119983) (Cell 24)

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Darius Landon Wilkins (JCID #P-1050395) (Cell 28)

Justice Andrew Espinoza (JCID #P-1010180) (Cell 29)

James Martin Ortega (JCID #P-192353) (Cell 29)

I performed strip searches of Loomis at 1704 hours, Ortega at 1713 hours and Wilkins at 1716 hours.

At about 1725 hours I assisted with a search of cell 29 currently housing Espinoza and Ortega. I removed an excessive amount of linens and extra uniforms and nuisance contraband. The contraband was removed in a clear plastic garbage bag and the linens and uniforms were placed in a laundry cart and placed back in the 6A staging area.

At about 1805 hours I interviewed Justice Espinoza and asked why he had an excessive amount of prestamped envelopes as well as the linens and uniforms. Espinoza did not have an answer for the uniforms and linens. I informed him those had been removed from his cell and I left one set of uniforms along with the one he was currently wearing. As far as the envelopes he told me a sergeant had approved him to have them. Based on the management entries he has commissary in the writ cage and he has to request items he wishes to have from Sgt. DeNuzzi. The envelopes were placed at the 6A desk and I let Espinoza know those would be placed in the writ cage with other items of his.

At about 1815 hours the search was concluded and my watch was completed.
