Complaint Narrative

Mr. [redacted] responded to the Internal Affairs Bureau where he complained about an officer who stopped him between 6:00 and 7:00 p.m. on January 27, 2004 in the area of the Royal Host Motel in the 900 block of East Colfax Avenue. Mr. [redacted] related that the officer stopped him without reason, cuffed him that caused him pain, and then broke his laptop computer. Please see Mr. [redacted] written statement for further details.

Action Taken

Sgt. Macdonald obtained a written statement from [redacted]. A QQ NICI search indicated that on January 21, 2004, Officer Michael Ryan 97020 ran a clearance on [redacted] at 1841 hours. CAD Incident DPD-04-0057918 indicates that Officer Ryan made a traffic stop in the 900 block of East Colfax at 18:34 hours. A photographic array was completed in which Officer Ryan was pictured in position number two. After reading the Photographic Lineup Admonition form, [redacted] viewed the lineup and indicated that the officer pictured in position number three (not Officer Ryan) "is indicative to the officer who stopped me." Mr. [redacted] was advised that this incident would be investigated by a District Six command officer and was given Commander D. Dille's name and phone number for further contacts.

For information regarding the complaint narrative and actions taken, please see Initial Inquiry Report. Also see Officer statement and Complainant statement.

PSRC

Several attempts were made to contact the complainant, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] at the phone number listed on the Initial Inquiry report. An attempt was made on 5-23-04 and a message was left on his answering machine. There was no response from the complainant for 11 days. Another attempt to contact the complainant was made on 6-2-04 and another message was left on his answering machine. As of this date, there has been no response made from the complainant. In addition, a records check indicates that the complainant is not currently incarcerated either in Denver or locally.

A statement was obtained from Officer Ryan. The statement made by the complainant and that made by Officer Ryan conflict with one another on several points (See statements). During the initial inquiry, the complainant related, during the photo lineup, that the photo of the officer he picked is indicative to the officer who stopped him. The complainant stated that he would never forget his face (the officer) incase he ran into him again, and the smile is identical to the one the officer gave him after he was released. The complainant did not pick Officer Ryan's photo from the lineup, but that of another officer.

It is the opinion of this supervisor, from a review of the statements, that Officer Ryan violated no departmental policies or procedures and no further action is recommended. However, it is noted that this initial inquiry cannot be further investigated due to the fact that the complainant will not or cannot contact this supervisor, in order to further investigate this matter.
