
Your complaint against Denver Police Corporal Todd Roumph was received in the Internal Affairs Bureau of the Denver Police Department on March 18, 2005. The case was investigated by personnel assigned to the Internal Affairs Bureau, and was then reviewed by the command staff of District Six.

After reviewing the case, including your statement, those of the Denver Cares personnel, and of the involved officer, I was not able to sustain the allegations against the officer. In order to sustain an allegation against an officer, there must be a preponderance of evidence to do so. In this instance the evidence does not support the allegations.
