Synopsis:


On July 5, 1999, Officer Rounph was responding to a call of a cold burglary. While attempting to park his police vehicle, he struck a vehicle that was legally parked.

Findings:

It is my opinion that Officer Rounph did not exercise proper care when he attempted to park his vehicle. As a result, an accident occurred that involved his vehicle and a parked vehicle. Fortunately, the damage was very minor.

Officer Rounph's actions are consistent with a violation of the **Denver Revised Municipal Code #54-158, Careless Driving**, which is a **4 point violation**. **This accident was preventable.**

This letter is to serve as an ORAL REPRIMAND for the violation(s) of Rules and Regulations Section 809, which reads as follows:


**RR-809 ROUGH OR CARELESS HANDLING OF CITY OR DEPARTMENTAL
PROPERTY**

"Members shall use care in handling departmental equipment and property, and shall report immediately any that is lost, damaged, or in bad order. Any members who willfully or negligently loses, damages, or destroys department property shall be subject to a departmental hearing to determine disposition of such cases."

Your recommendation that the officer receive an Oral Reprimand for this violation has been reviewed and approved.

This oral reprimand is the result of the officer's preventable police vehicle accident on July 5, 1999, at the location of the 1300 block of Pearl Street.
