NATURE AND SCOPE OF INVESTIGATION

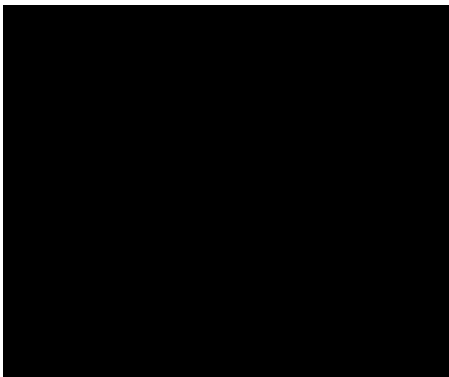
On November 16th, 2011, Trooper Ryan Hafner drove his marked patrol car while on duty and in CSP uniform to the Canon City National Bank where his estranged wife is employed. Ryan entered the bank to speak with his wife [REDACTED]. He was told she might be out to lunch. Ryan told the bank employees that he believed she was there because her car was outside. Hafner then sat in his patrol car outside the bank and sent a series of text messages and one voice mail to [REDACTED] stating that he knew she was hiding inside and she needed to come out to sign paperwork for a personal vehicle he was buying.

[REDACTED] was able to take a break from work shortly after receiving the messages from Ryan and walked outside to speak with him. [REDACTED] surreptitiously recorded the conversation that took place in front of the bank. [REDACTED] and Ryan argued in the parking lot regarding a power of attorney that Ryan needed to have signed to trade in his truck for a new vehicle. During the exchange, bank employees became concerned about Ryan's agitated state and the impact the scene was having on potential customers.

[REDACTED] called [REDACTED] and filed a formal complaint against Ryan. [REDACTED] stated that his behavior was becoming more erratic and in addition to the incident in front of the bank [REDACTED] believed Ryan may be involved in additional on-duty misconduct. [REDACTED] stated that she believed Ryan was spending an extraordinary amount of time on the phone with another Trooper whom he was romantically involved with.

INVESTIGATIVE FINDINGS

Trooper Ryan Hafner may have violated the following Colorado Revised Statutes and CSP General Orders:

C.R.S. 18-9-106. Disorderly Conduct (PO1)

(1) A person commits disorderly conduct if he or she intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly:

(a) Makes a coarse and obviously offensive utterance, gesture, or display in a public place and the utterance, gesture, or display tends to incite an immediate breach of the peace.

C.R.S. 18-9-111 Harassment (M3)

(1) A person commits harassment if, with intent to harass, annoy, or alarm another person, he or she:

(e) Initiates communication with a person, anonymously or otherwise, by telephone, telephone network, data network, text message, instant message, computer, computer network, or computer system in a manner intended to harass or threaten bodily injury or property damage, or makes any comment, request, suggestion, or proposal by telephone, computer, computer network, or computer system that is obscene.

C.R.S. 18-4-401 Theft (F4)

(1) A person commits theft when he knowingly obtains or exercises control over anything of value of another without authorization, or by threat or deception, and:

(a) Intends to deprive the other person permanently of the use or benefit of the thing of value.

(c) A class 4 felony if the value of the thing involved is one thousand dollars or more but less than twenty thousand dollars.

CSP General Orders:

1. Members will obey the law.
2. Members will be truthful and complete in their accounts and reports.
5. Members will conduct themselves so as to preserve the public trust and will utilize their authority appropriately.
6. Members will avoid any conduct that may bring discredit upon, or undermine the credibility of themselves, the Colorado State Patrol, or the police profession.
