AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF WARRANTLESS ARREST

Affiant, **Officer Cameron Harrell Badge #439**, being duly sworn upon oath, says that there is probable cause for the warrantless arrest of, **TIMOTHY AARON SEABRA / DOB 07-06-1992**; for the crime(s) stated, and that the following facts are true and correct upon best knowledge, information, and belief:

Your affiant learned of these facts by investigation, by speaking with other officers or reading other officers' police reports. The facts establishing probable cause for arrest are that on **01-25-2026** at approximately **13:25**, in the County of **Larimer**, State of Colorado, Town of Johnstown, at **4590 Trade St Apt. 4212**. The following criminal activity occurred:

PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENT

On 01-25-2026, at approximately 1325 hours, Officers received a call for service regarding a burglary of an occupied structure. Officers were advised that an ex-boyfriend, later identified as TIMOTHY SEABRA, had unlawfully entered the apartment while the victim, later identified as ABIGAIL BANDY, was asleep.

TIMOTHY would then flee the scene before Officers arrived on the scene. While speaking to ABIGAIL, she stated the following:

ABIGAIL stated that she was in her apartment, asleep in bed, when she woke up to TIMOTHY standing over her and began pleading with her to work things out. ABIGAIL advised TIMOTHY entered her own apartment by guessing the access code for the door. ABIGAIL advised that TIMOTHY was not supposed to be there and does not live there. ABIGAIL advised that she had changed the code since they had broken up.

While inside the apartment, ABIGAIL then began telling TIMOTHY to leave her apartment, but he refused to leave as he continued pleading with her. ABIGAIL further mentioned that TIMOTHY then forcefully grabbed her by the arm, but she claimed it did not hurt her. She stated that as she was getting out of bed, TIMOTHY then grabbed both of her arms and assisted her in standing, but again stated it did not cause her pain.

ABIGAIL also said TIMOTHY was standing at her bedroom door, blocking her ability to leave. She then stated that after she got past the bedroom door, she attempted to walk through her kitchen to get to the front door of the apartment to leave, but TIMOTHY again blocked her path to the front door, then also blocked the front door, preventing her from leaving the situation. ABIGAIL expressed that TIMOTHY was well aware that she was trying to leave the apartment to avoid the situation, but he still blocked her from leaving.

ABIGAIL stated that she and TIMOTHY were in a relationship for a year and a half and broke up approximately a week prior to this incident. ABIGAIL also provided video footage from her Ring Camera of TIMOTHY walking in the apartment at 1221 hours and leaving at 1233 hours.

Contact was made with TIMOTHY at his place of employment by Officer Olds, SGT Rashid, and Officer Lorenzo. TIMOTHY was read his Miranda Rights from a preprinted department-issued card. TIMOTHY understood his rights and agreed to speak with Johnstown Officers regarding this criminal case.

Officer Olds and SGT Rashid were the ones who spoke with TIMOTHY. During the conversation, TIMOTHY advised that he went over to ABIGAIL's apartment to get his garage door opener and to talk things out. TIMOTHY advised that he allowed ABIGAIL to move freely throughout the apartment and did not restrict her movements. TIMOTHY also advised that there was no physical altercation that took place while over there, in fact would also advised there was never a physical altercation that took place during the intimate relationship. TIMOTHY advised that he would leave the apartment a short time later.

When asked, TIMOTHY advised he still considered them as boyfriend and girlfriend when he entered the apartment, regardless of whether he was to be there gather his garage door opener. TIMOTHY advised that he also has personal belongings at the apartment and leaves them there as he comes and goes from the apartment.

TIMOTHY was asked further about their relationship status. TIMOTHY goes on to explain that they (he and ABIGAIL) went to the Melting Pot on Saturday, presumed to be on January 17, 2026. TIMOTHY advised that there was a verbal argument about the volume of the Denver Broncos football game. After the game, both TIMOTHY and ABIGAIL would block each other on their phones. TIMOTHY advised he attempted to call ABIGAIL on Tuesday, January 20, 2026, due to her sister being in the emergency room. TIMOTHY discovered this information after seeing a call for service for ABIGAIL's sister. After calling her and finding out he had been blocked, he blocked his number and would call. Based on call logs and voicemails, this is mainly how TIMOTHY would communicate with ABIGAIL.

After leaving the apartment, TIMOTHY would call his ex-wife and advise her that he had entered his girlfriend's apartment using a code he was provided. Was contacted by ABIGAIL's sister and was told he was trespassing and he left. He also advised that he was going to jail and his life was over. These comments would cause the ex-wife to call in to Weld County Dispatch which would generate a call for service regarding TIMOTHY's mental health wellbeing.

Based on the conversation with TIMOTHY, he described that no crime had been committed. The conversation with TIMOTHY confirmed he was on the scene. TIMOTHY's story also aligns with most of the chain of events that ABIGAIL told.
